

#### Section 'A' Tulips


- Show with only 2 leaves

1. Tulip, Single red..... 1 bloom
2. Tulip, Single yellow..... 1 bloom
3. Tulip, Single pink..... 1 bloom
4. Tulip, Single purple..... 1 bloom
5. Tulip, Single white ..... 1 bloom
6. Tulip, Single, Any other colour(s)..... 1 bloom
7. Tulip, Double, any colour..... 1 bloom
8. Tulip, Lily-type, any colour..... 1 bloom
9. Tulip, Fringed, any colour ..... 1 bloom
10. Tulip, Parrot, any colour ..... 1 bloom
11. Tulip, Multiflora (2-8 blooms on one stem)..... 1 stem
12. Tulip, Viridiflora ..... 1 bloom
13. Tulip, Any other cultivar ..... 1 bloom
14. Tulip, collection, 3 different cultivars ..... 3 blooms/stems

#### Section 'B' Other Specimens

15. Allium, 1 cultivar..... 1 stem
16. Bleeding Heart... UNDER 60 cm / 24" ..... 1 branch
17. Foliage, (from any plant) (NIP) ..... 1 stem
18. Heuchera, 1 cultivar ..... 3 leaves
19. Hosta solid colour..... 1 leaf
20. Hosta variegated ..... 1 leaf
21. Iris, Medium Bearded, 1 cultivar ..... 1 stalk
22. Iris, Miniature Dwarf Bearded, 1 cultivar ..... 3 stalks
23. Iris, Any other cultivar ..... 1 stalk
24. Narcissus, white any type, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** ..... 1 scape
25. Narcissus, yellow any type, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** ..... 1 scape

26. Narcissus, Bicolour any type, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** ..... 1 scape
27. Narcissus, Double any type, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** ..... 1 scape
28. Pansy, any colour..... 3 stems
29. Peony, any type (NIP) ..... 1 bloom
30. Tree Peony, any colour..... 1 bloom
31. Solomon Seal, UNDER 76 cm / 30" ..... 1 stem
32. Viola, (Johnny Jump Up) ..... 3 stems
33. Any Native Ephemeral (must be garden grown) ..... 1 bloom/1 stem
34. Any other bulb, corm, rhizome or tuber (NIP)..... 1 bloom
35. Any other bulb, corm, rhizome or tuber (NIP)..... 1 stem
36. Any other perennial (NIP)..... 1 bloom
37. Any other perennial (NIP)..... 1 stem

#### Section 'C' Branches of Trees, Shrubs and Vines

##### Lilac branches – maximum. size 60 cm / 24"

38. Lilac, Single white ..... 1 branch
39. Lilac, Single light purple..... 1 branch
40. Lilac, Single dark purple..... 1 branch
41. Lilac, Single, any other colour..... 1 branch
42. Lilac, Double, white ..... 1 branch
43. Lilac, Double, any other colour..... 1 branch
44. Lilac Collection, 3 different cultivars ..... 3 branches
45. Any other flowering branch / vine UNDER 76 cm / 30" (NIP)..... 1 branch
46. Any branch / vine showing only foliage, UNDER 76 cm / 30" (NIP) ..... 1 branch

#### Section 'D' Container Grown Plants

Refer to 'Houseplants' in Definition of terms. All classes are Open.

47. Plant grown for foliage max. pot size 25cm / 10" (NIP).....1 pot
48. Plant grown for bloom max. pot size 25cm / 10" (NIP) .....1 pot

#### Section 'E' Vegetables

49. Asparagus, uniform in width & length & approx. 20 cm" In length..... 3 stalks
50. Rhubarb, 1 cultivar, pull, do not cut stalks, top to 5cm in a fan ..... 3 stalks
51. Any other vegetable/herb, 1 cultivar, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** .....suitable #
