DIVISION I HORTICULTURE

All specimen classes are OPEN; you may enter TWO ITEMS but they must be different cultivars. Exception to this rule will be specified where applicable.

Section 'A' Flower Specimens

1. Aster, annual 1 cultivar..... 3 blooms
2. Begonia, tuberous, **with foliage**, floating in water..... 1 bloom
Floating means not touching the sides or bottom of the container. Bring bloom and container separately & put together at the show.
3. Begonia, other types 1 stem
4. Celosia 1 plume
5. Coleus 1 stem
6. Cosmos maximum 45 cm (18") 1 stem
7. Cosmos collection, 3 cultivars, maximum 45cm (18")..... 3 stems
8. Dahlia, any colour/type, **UNLIMITED ENTRIES**..... 1 bloom
9. Daylily (Hemerocallis), single, no foliage..... 1 bloom
10. Daylily (Hemerocallis), spider / UFO, no foliage 1 bloom
11. Daylily (Hemerocallis), double, no foliage 1 bloom
12. Echinacea, any colour..... 1 bloom
13. Foliage, from any plant (NIP)..... 1 stem/leaf
14. Geranium (Pelargonium) 1 stem
15. Gladiolus..... 1 stem
16. Grasses, Ornamental, 1 cultivar (NIP), **UNDER** 1.0 m / 39" 3 stems
17. Impatiens..... 1 stem
18. Japanese Anemone 1 stem
19. Marigold, single, 1 cultivar 3 stems
20. Marigold, double, 1 cultivar 3 stems
21. Milkweed, native cultivars only, not tropical variety..... 1 stem
22. Phlox, white 1 stem
23. Phlox, any other colour 1 stem
24. Rose, any type 1 bloom
25. Rose, any type 1 spray
26. Rudbeckia 3 stems
27. Salvia, 1 cultivar..... 3 stems
28. Sedum 1 stem
29. Sunflower, any colour, weighted containers please..... 1 bloom
30. Any tropical (NIP) (see Definition of Terms) 1 bloom/stem
31. Zinnia, any colour/type..... 1 bloom
32. Any other annual (NIP) 1 bloom
33. Any other annual (NIP) 1 stem
34. Any other perennial/biennial (NIP)..... 1 bloom
35. Any other perennial/biennial (NIP)..... 1 stem

Section 'B' Branches of Trees, Shrubs and Vines

ALL BRANCHES MUST BE UNDER 76 cm / 30"

36. Hibiscus (Rose of Sharon) 1 branch
37. Hydrangea, ball type..... 1 branch
38. Hydrangea, cone type 1 branch
39. Hydrangea, lace type..... 1 branch
40. Any other flowering branch (NIP)..... 1 branch
41. Any other foliage branch (NIP) 1 branch
42. Any flowering vine (NIP) 1 branch
43. Any foliage vine (NIP) 1 branch

Section 'C' Fruits & Vegetables

44. Beans, 1 cultivar (with calyx & portion of stem attached)..... 5 pods
45. Beets, 1 cultivar (tops trimmed to 1.3 cm/0.5" above crown,
leave root on) 3 roots
46. Cabbage, (large coarse outer leaves may be removed) 1 head
47. Carrots, 1 cultivar (topped to 1.3 cm/0.5") 3 roots
48. Cucumbers, slicing, 1 cultivar (short stem should remain)..... 2 fruit
49. Cucumbers, pickling, 1 cultivar (short stem should remain) 3 fruit
50. Garlic, any type..... 2 bulbs
51. Herbs – culinary, 3 types, (must be named)..... 3 stems
52. Lettuce, head type (damaged outer leaves should be removed) 1 plant
53. Onions, 1 cultivar..... 3 bulbs
Do not peel, only broken outer scales should be removed.
Neatly trim tops and remove roots just below the base.
54. Peppers, 1 cultivar (leave approx. 1.5 cm / 1/2"of stem) 2 fruit
55. Potatoes, 1 cultivar, (brush clean)..... 3 tubers
56. Squash, summer, any type, (stem left attached & trimmed) 1 fruit
57. Tomatoes, over 5 cm / 2", diameter, 1 cultivar
(preferable to leave calyx) 3 fruit
58. Tomatoes, 5 cm / 2" & under, diameter, 1 cultivar (preferable to leave calyx) 5 fruit
59. Tomatoes any variety 1 truss
60. Any other fruit, 1 cultivar (NIP), **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** suitable #
61. Any other vegetable, 1 cultivar (NIP), **UNLIMITED ENTRIES** suitable #

Section 'D' Collections Shown for cultural perfection

For each class show 3 different plants or 3 different cultivars/varieties of the same plant species (NIP), container of choice.

62. Coleus..... 3 stems
63. Cut flowers – Annuals..... 3 stems
64. Cut flowers – Perennials..... 3 stems
65. Tomatoes..... 3 fruit
66. Peppers 3 fruit
67. Mixed vegetables 3 entries
