DIVISION I HORTICULTURE

All specimen classes are OPEN; you may enter TWO ITEMS but they must be different cultivars. Exception to this rule will be specified where applicable.

Section 'A' Roses

- The Rose form, ideally, should be round, symmetrical and be $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ open
- NIP = Named if Possible – On all the roses
- Refer to the Definition of Terms for description of spray

45. Any other vine, flowering or foliage, UNDER 38 cm / 15" (NIP)1 branch

Section 'D' Fruits & Vegetables

46. Lettuce, 1 cultivar.....1 plant
47. Onions, green, 1 cultivar (loose skin removed, roots trimmed to 1.3 cm / ½", tops trimmed 15-20 cm /6-8" above white shank)3 plants
48. Peas, 1 cultivar (with calyx & portion of stem attached)..... 5 pods
49. Radishes, 1 cultivar trim top to 2.5 cm /1"3 plants
50. Spinach, 1 cultivar3 leaves
51. Strawberries, 1 cultivar5 berries
52. Any other fruit/vegetable, 1 cultivar (NIP) **UNLIMITED ENTRIES**suitable #
